TODAY IN HISTORY

Space shuttle Challenger astronaut, Kathryn Sullivan, became the first American woman to walk in space in 1984. After leaving NASA, Dr. Sullivan served as President and CEO of the COSI Columbus, an interactive science center in Columbus, Ohio and as Director for Ohio State University's Battelle Center for Mathematics and Science Education Policy. Dr. Sullivan was inducted into the Astronaut Hall of Fame. Also in 2004. Dr. Sullivan received the Adler Planetarium Women in Space Science Award. In January 2011, the White House sent to the Senate the nomination of Dr. Sullivan by President Obama to be an assistant secretary of commerce. On May 4, 2011, Dr. Sullivan, was confirmed by unanimous consent of the U.S. Senate and appointed by President Obama to serve as assistant secretary of commerce for environmental observation and prediction and deputy administrator for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Dr. Sullivan assumed her current role as Acting Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere and Acting NOAA Administrator on February 28, 2013.
