## TODAY IN HISTORY

Dale Chihuly was born in 1941. Chihuly is an American glass sculptor and entrepreneur. His works are considered unique to the field of blown glass, "moving it into the realm of large-scale sculpture," (Museum of Fine Arts, Boston). The technical difficulties of working with glass forms are considerable, yet Chihuly uses it as the primary medium for installations and environmental artwork. Chihuly's largest permanent exhibit can be found at the Oklahoma City Museum of Art. Chihuly also has galleries in partnership with MGM and the Bellagio in Las Vegas. Since the 1970s, working with a team of master glassblowers and assistants has enabled him to produce architectural glass art of a scale and quantity unimaginable working alone or with only one assistant. In 2010 the Space Needle Corporation submitted a proposal for an exhibition of Chihuly's work at a site in the Seattle Center. It is now a museum of some of Chihuly's finest work.
